Love in Shakespeare / Nick Hutchison



Nick Hutchison will explore how Shakespeare presents ideas about love and romance focusing on textual clues, staging issues, and the role of the audience, using examples from *Othello*, *The Taming of the Shrew*, *Measure for Measure* and *The Winter's Tale*.

Nick Hutchison is an actor, director and lecturer who has directed Shakespeare's plays across the globe. He lectures for Shakespeare's Globe and at universities worldwide and on Jacobean Theatre for LAMDA and RADA.

Michael Symmons Roberts will deliver a fascinating presentation during which he will read from and answer questions on his poetry, including 'To John Donne'. The session will offer students a unique chance to explore the writing of this leading poet.

Michael Symmons Roberts FRSL is a multi-award-winning poet. He has written seven collections of poetry as well as novels and libretti. Roberts is Professor of Poetry at Manchester Metropolitan University.

Jon Rich explores the opportunities offered by the genres of poetry, prose and drama and suggests ways in which students can exploit their knowledge of the three different genres.
